As you may be aware, today the Australian House of Representatives was dissolved with a federal election to take place on 18 May 2019. This means that the Australian Government is now in caretaker until the election result is clear, or if there is a change of government, until the new government is appointed.

I am pleased to confirm that the ongoing negotiations on transitional arrangements with Timor-Leste and NOGA will not be affected during the caretaker period. Australia's Prime Minister, the Hon Scott Morrison MP and Minister for Resources and Northern Australia, Senator the Hon Matthew Canavan have written to their Timorese counterparts advising them in similar terms.

I look forward to continuing to work with you to finalise the transitional arrangements. If you would like to discuss this matter please do not hesitate to contact me.

Hi Lisa,

Thanks for the reply to my email of 9 March 2018. Whilst your email gives me some comfort that "*should NOGA request such a PSC, Australia will support that decision to ensure security of title continues for NOGA's current title area*" the fact that there is no mention of Laminaria and Corallina Fields in Article 4, Annexure D: Transitional Provisions of the Treaty means the uncertainty for our business (particularly our financiers) will continue until such time as this is actioned.

I am writing to request the Australian Government:

(i) to give us written confirmation that the portion of the Laminaria and Corallina Fields will be given the same treatment as the portion of Australian exploration permit WA-523-P, including the Buffalo Oil Field, that now falls within the continental shelf of Timor Leste pursuant to Article 2 of the Treaty, including in relation to security of title and any other rights held by us as titleholder, that these shall be preserved through conditions equivalent to those in place under Australian domestic law; and (ii) that it will work with the Timorese Government to action this change in the same manner, and in the same time frame, as that for other impacted permits, including the Buffalo Oil field.

We have approached the Timor Leste Government through ANPM regarding the issuance for a Production Sharing Contract to replace the 71.5% of WA-18-L and the 5.6% of AC-L5 that now lies in the continental shelf of Timor Leste. We seek your seek your advice on the issuance of these new PSC's. We understand this is a process that may take some time, and the continued uncertainty is having a significant impact on our ability to conduct "business as usual". Our 2018 development plans including a subsea campaign and well intervention to increase our production and extend our field life are being impacted by uncertainty regarding application of laws, particularly in relation to migration, customs and labour.^{\$45}

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I have attached a map showing the Laminaria and Corallina petroleum deposits extend across the new continental shelf boundary. Please can you advise the expected timing for resolving the question of the application of laws in relation to these now "straddling deposits", as per Article 8 of the Treaty.

Hi s47F,

Apologies again for my delayed response.

The maritime boundary treaty does not contain an explicit obligation on Timor-Leste to issue an equivalent production sharing contract (PSC) for the portions of WA-18-L and AC/L5. This does not, however, preclude a PSC being issued for those portions which will lie on Timorese seabed once the Treaty enters into force should NOGA wish to enter a PSC for these areas. Should NOGA request such a PSC, Australia will support that decision to ensure security of title continues for NOGA's current title area.

With regards to the point you raise about the Laminaria reserves falling to the east of the new maritime boundary, I note that based on current data held by the National Offshore Petroleum Titles Administrator (NOPTA) on the Laminaria field, it was the Australian Government's understanding that the field did not extend across the maritime boundary. As such, I therefore request that any new data you do have be provided to NOPTA (or to me and I will pass it on to NOPTA) as soon as possible. I would note that it will ultimately be a matter for the two Governments to determine whether a deposit extends across the continental shelf boundary. As always, happy to discuss.

I would like to draw your attention to the latest press release from the PCA Conciliation Commission published on 25 February 2018 regarding the progress of the Conciliation between Timor-Leste and Australia

(<u>https://pcacases.com/web/sendAttach/2295</u>). You will see that Australia and Timor-Leste have agreed to sign their new Maritime Boundaries Treaty at <u>5pm (New York time) on 6 March 2018 in</u> <u>New York</u> (6am Perth, Australia time and 9am Australian Eastern Standard Time on 7 March 2018). The Secretary-General of the United Nations, H.E. Antonio Guterres, will host the signing ceremony at United Nations Headquarters. He will witness the signature of the Treaty along with the Chairman of the Conciliation Commission, H.E. Ambassador Peter Taksoe-Jensen. Once Treaty signature is concluded, Australia and Timor-Leste will be in contact with details of how the Treaty can be viewed.

As the press releases indicates, this was the final set of Conciliation Commission meetings to be held as part of the Conciliation process. The Commission has provided its conclusions to Australia and Timor-Leste with a view to providing them an informed basis to take a decision on the development of the Greater Sunrise gas fields as a shared resource. It is expected that the Commission will make its report on the conciliation proceedings public in mid-April 2018.

In parallel, both governments are progressing matters relating to transitional arrangements for companies and will continue to engage with all the affected parties. It is important to note that the signing of the Treaty will have no immediate impact on your operations, with business as usual in the Joint Petroleum Development Area and Australia's offshore area. After Treaty signature, both Australia and Timor-Leste will undertake their respective domestic processes to ratify the Treaty in order for it to come into effect.

We will provide more information on timeframes in future updates.
