### **PURPOSE OF MEETING**

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- You and the Prime Minister are meeting with Mr Dario Amodei, co-founder and CEO of Anthropic. A biography is at [Attachment A](#).

### WHAT WE WANT

- Encourage Anthropic's investment and operations in Australia in line with our national interest.
- Recognise signing of the *Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on Opportunities for Collaboration on AI* between Anthropic and the Albanese Government.
- Reinforce the importance of managing AI's impact on Australia's economy and society.

### WHAT THEY WANT:

- To discuss Mr Amodei's views on AI development and opportunities for investment in Australia.

### **KEY MESSAGES**

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- Australia is a great place for Anthropic to invest. We offer a stable and secure operating context, vast sources of renewable energy, land and talent.
- We want an enduring collaboration with Anthropic. The MoU is a good start and we are committed to turn intent into action in key areas like investment, safety and research.
- It is essential that benefits accrue to Australians and the Australian economy from AI investments.

### **BACKGROUND**

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[MoU on opportunities for AI collaboration](#)

- This is the first collaborative arrangement agreed with a leading AI company to advance the goals of the National AI Plan. The MoU will support Australia's ambition to be a leader in AI by highlighting Australia as an attractive place to invest for the world's leading AI companies.
  - The Government is also in [s 22](#) and is open to entering collaborative arrangements with other leading AI companies where it advances the goals of the National AI Plan.
- The areas of collaboration in the MoU are tailored to areas of shared interest and Anthropic's strengths. This MoU has a focus on advanced AI and safety; understanding economic and productivity impacts; supporting research, skills, startups, SMEs and the APS; and engaging on infrastructure, transmission and renewable energy considerations.
- The MoU will operate like a 'head agreement', with further detailed collaborations, for instance on AI safety or AI use by the APS, possibly negotiated between relevant departments and Anthropic.

#### Investment in data centres

- The MoU includes a commitment by Anthropic to operate in line with the Albanese Government's *Expectations of data centres and AI infrastructure developers*.
  - Anthropic is drawn to Australia as a data centre investment destination due to the potential for cost-effective renewable energy. Anthropic recently made a public commitment in the US to pay its share of transmission and energy generation costs to mitigate impacts on consumers. Anthropic extends this commitment to Australia.

- Between October and December 2025, the Government sought views from the Copyright and AI Reference Group (CAIRG) on 3 priority areas:
  - encouraging fair, legal avenues for using copyright material in AI through examination of licensing arrangements
  - improving certainty on the application of copyright law to material generated through the use of AI, and
  - exploring avenues for less costly enforcement in relation to AI outputs-related infringement, including through a potential small claims forum.
- The Attorney-General is considering next steps. Anthropic is not a member of the CAIRG.

### Anthropic

- Anthropic was founded in 2021, by former members of OpenAI, including siblings Dario and Daniela Amodei, who are CEO and President, respectively. Anthropic is headquartered in San Francisco.
- Anthropic develops frontier AI models. It works with some of the region's most innovative organisations—from enterprises like Canva, Quantum, and Commonwealth Bank of Australia, to startups pioneering new AI applications across diverse fields such as AgTech, physical AI and Climate Tech.
- Anthropic positions itself as a safety-focused AI developer, with publicly documented approaches to risk management and invests heavily in foundational research to ensure its models are steerable and interpretable to ensure reliability and safety.

- Claude has been used to build child welfare software, automate biomedical research tasks, and accelerate scientific discovery across emergency response, nuclear deterrence, fusion energy, and materials science.
- There are no Government grants with Anthropic as either a grantee or a project partner.

#### Mr Amodei's public views on AI capabilities and impacts

- Mr Amodei has argued that AI systems with substantially advanced general capabilities could emerge sooner than many institutions are prepared for, potentially within the next few years. He has suggested this mismatch between technical progress and governance could pose economic and societal risks.
- He has also raised concerns about labour-market disruption, particularly for entry-level white-collar roles, arguing that the pace of change may exceed the speed of economic adjustment, potentially displacing up to half of entry-level roles within one to 5 years.

#### Prior meetings

- Assistant Minister Charlton met with Mr Amodei on 18 February 2026 at the India AI Impact Summit to discuss Anthropic's plans for AI investment in Australia and progress discussions on the MoU.
- Assistant Minister Charlton met with Anthropic on 11 August 2025 in the US.
- A range of meetings including the department, the Minister's and Assistant Minister's offices and Anthropic have occurred to negotiate the MoU.

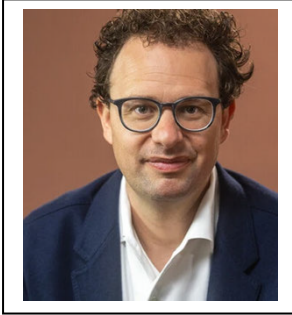

**Biography****Dario Amodei, CEO Anthropic PBC****Background**

Dario Amodei is the co-founder and Chief Executive Officer of Anthropic, a US-based artificial intelligence company that develops the Claude family of large language models. Anthropic is a major developer of large-scale AI systems and presents its work as focused on improving reliability, interpretability, and risk management alongside commercial deployment. Amodei is a regular public commentator on the opportunities and risks associated with advanced AI and engages frequently with governments and international forums on AI governance, safety, and policy issues.

**Role at Anthropic**

Amodei co-founded Anthropic in 2021 with his sister, Daniela Amodei, and other former senior staff from OpenAI. The founders left OpenAI following differences in views about organisational direction and approach. Since its establishment, Anthropic has grown into a significant player in the frontier AI sector, developing and deploying the Claude model family for enterprise and public use. Under Amodei's leadership, the company has invested in technical research on interpretability, alignment, and evaluation, and has positioned itself as a safety-focused competitor among leading AI developers.

Amodei has published essays and opinion pieces arguing that rapid advances in AI capability should be accompanied by stronger technical safeguards and clearer governance arrangements. In 2025, he was named to Time magazine's list of the 100 most influential people in the world, reflecting his increased visibility in global technology and AI policy discussions.

**Previous work at OpenAI**

Before founding Anthropic, Amodei held senior research leadership roles at OpenAI, including Vice President of Research. During this period, he was involved in the development and scaling of large language models and is credited in public profiles with contributing to early work on methods for training models using human feedback. His experience at OpenAI informed his subsequent focus on AI risk and alignment.

### Mr Michael Sellitto, Head of Global Affairs, Anthropic

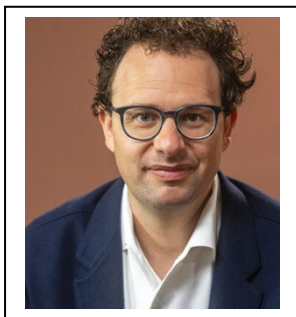
Mr Michael Sellitto is Head of Global Affairs at Anthropic, an artificial intelligence safety and research company. He joined Anthropic in June 2022 and was appointed Head of Global Affairs in 2023, after serving as Head of Geopolitics and Security (June 2022 to November 2023).

From 2015 to 2018, Mr Sellitto served in the White House as Director for Cybersecurity Policy on the National Security Council staff. He led international engagement on cybersecurity policy, including work on strategic stability in cyberspace, the digital economy and internet governance, and negotiations to develop cybersecurity partnerships.

Before joining Anthropic, he was the founding Deputy Director of the Stanford Institute for Human-Centered Artificial Intelligence (HAI). Earlier, he served at the US Department of State as a special assistant to Deputy Secretaries William J. Burns and Antony Blinken.

Mr Sellitto is an Adjunct Senior Fellow with the Center for a New American Security (CNAS), in the Technology and National Security Program. He is also a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and serves on the Board of Directors of the Frontier Model Forum.

He holds a Master of Public Policy from Harvard Kennedy School and a Bachelor of Science from New York University Stern School of Business.
