Re: Application for Accelerated Reviews

Dear Sir or Madam:

I am writing to you in regarding to apply for Accelerated Reviews for the company named Guangdong Jinxicheng Al.Manufacturing Co., Ltd

Guangdong Jinxicheng Al.Manufacturing Co., Ltd was founded in 1993 and mainly manufactures aluminum alloy products. The company is with complete matched equipments, advanced technology and overall products.

Guangdong Jinxicheng Al.Manufacturing Co., Ltd has big market in the mainland of China, we are planning to extend the business to Australia currently, and the goods will be included aluminum extrusion products that have been further processed or fabricated to a limited extent, after aluminum has been extruded through a die. For example, aluminum extrusion products that have been painted, anodized, or otherwise coated, or worked (e.g. precision cut, machined, punched or drilled) fall within the scope of the goods. The further description of the goods is under below:

Aluminium extrusions produced via an extrusion process, of alloys having

metallic elements falling within the alloy designations published by The

Aluminium Association commencing with 1, 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7 (or proprietary or other certifying body equivalents), with the finish being as extruded (mill), mechanical, anodized or painted or otherwise coated, whether or not worked, having a wall thickness or diameter greater than 0.5 mm., with a maximum weight per metre of 27 kilograms and a profile or cross-section which fits within a circle having a diameter of 421 mm.

I have browsed over the Customs Act, and found out aluminum extrusion is subjected of the current Anti-Dumping Notice No.2012/18, Dumping Commodity Register R.12. As an exporter, the company hasn't supplied any aluminum extrusions to Australia yet. On behalf of Guangdong Jinxicheng Al.Manufacturing Co., Ltd, I would like to take this opportunity to apply for Accelerated Reviews of Anti-Dumping Measures and countervailing of Aluminum Extrusions exported to Australia from China. I have reviewed the Customs Act 1901 – Sect 269ZF, and believe that the company meets the requirements set out in the Act and should be eligible to apply for such a review.

I will be very much appreciated if you may provide any instruction on this matter, and hope to get this application approved as early as possible.
