



## AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/40

### Certain steel shelving kits

### Exported from Thailand and the People's Republic of China

### Expiry of anti-dumping measures

Anti-dumping measures applicable to certain steel shelving kits exported from Thailand were initially imposed on 26 September 2001 following Ministerial consideration of Trade Measures Report No. 44.

Anti-dumping measures applicable to certain steel shelving kits exported from the People's Republic of China (China) were initially imposed on 3 October 2001 following Ministerial consideration of Trade Measures Report No. 31.

On 18 November 2005 the Australian Customs Service (Customs) published notices in *The Australian* in relation to the expiry of those anti-dumping measures. The notices invited those persons as specified at section 269ZHB(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* to apply to Customs for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures by 17 January 2006.

As Customs received no applications for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures, the anti-dumping measures applicable to certain steel shelving kits exported from Thailand will expire on 26 September 2006. The anti-dumping measures applicable to certain steel shelving kits exported from China will expire on 3 October 2006. Therefore on and from these dates respective anti-dumping measures will no longer apply.
