



## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/94**

### **Aluminium road wheels exported from the People's Republic of China**

### **Withdrawal of application for an accelerated review of anti-dumping measures**

#### ***Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB***

On 16 April 2015, I, Dale Seymour, Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission commenced an accelerated review of the anti-dumping measures applying to aluminium road wheels exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China) in so far as they relate to a new exporter, Changzhou Science and Technology Co. Ltd. (Changzhou).

Under subsection 269ZH(b) of the *Customs Act 1901*, the then Australian Customs and Border Protection Service required and took securities under section 42 of that Act in respect of interim dumping and countervailing duty that may be payable on exports by Changzhou of aluminium road wheels.

On 25 May 2015, Changzhou withdrew its application for an accelerated review of the anti-dumping measures in respect of aluminium road wheels exported to Australia from China. Accordingly, I have ceased the accelerated review.

Cessation of this accelerated review means that securities taken on aluminium road wheels exported by Changzhou and entered for home consumption in the period 16 April 2015 to 29 July 2015 (the cessation date) will now be converted to interim dumping and countervailing duty.

The applicable rates of duty are at the 'all other exporters' rate specified in the dumping duty notice and the countervailing duty notice published on 5 July 2012. Future exports of aluminium road wheels to Australia by Changzhou will also be subject to this rate of duty.
