Termination of an Accelerated Review

CUSTOMS ACT 1901 – Part XV B

On 26 November 2012, ACDN 2012/57 was published, providing notification that the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (Customs and Border Protection) had commenced an accelerated review of the current anti-dumping and countervailing measures in respect of certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from China in so far as they related to new exporter Longkou Conglin Aluminium Co. Ltd (LCA).

As the application for the accelerated review was not rejected by the CEO, the application date of 9 November 2012 was the initiation date of the accelerated review. ACDN 2012/57 contains further details on the existing measures.

LCA was sent an exporter questionnaire to complete by 15 December 2012 (next working day 17 December 2012). On LCA's request this due date was extended to 2 January 2013. LCA has not provided a response to the exporter questionnaire by the due date.

The refusal to furnish a response to the exporter questionnaire amounts to a refusal to co-operate with an aspect of the review, and Customs and Border Protection recommended that the delegate of the CEO terminate the review on this basis.

In accordance with s.269ZE(3)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901*, the delegate of the CEO has decided to terminate the investigation.

Termination of this accelerated review means that if LCA has exports of aluminium extrusions that are subject to securities (i.e. aluminium extrusions exported by LCA that were imported and entered for home consumption in Australia between 9 November 2012 to 3 January 2013) these securities will now be converted to interim dumping duty and interim countervailing duty at the rate applicable to 'selected non-cooperating exporters' from China under the dumping duty notice and countervailing

duty notice published by Customs and Border Protection on 27 August 2011. Future exports of aluminium extrusions by LCA will also be subject to this level of measures.
