



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2014/133

Prepared or preserved tomatoes Exported to Australia from Italy Clarification to Anti-Dumping Notice No. 2014/99 related to an exemption inquiry

Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975

On 18 November 2014, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission initiated an exemption inquiry in relation to certain prepared or preserved tomatoes subject to anti-dumping measures. The exemption is being sought pursuant to subsection 8(7)(a) of the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* (Dumping Duty Act). A description of the goods the subject of the exemption inquiry (the exemption goods) is provided in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/99, which is available at www.adcommission.gov.au.

In particular, ADN No. 2014/99 describes the exemption goods as:

- canned cherry tomatoes
- canned organic tomatoes, and
- canned San Marzano tomatoes.

The Commission considers it necessary to amend the description of the exemption goods in ADN No. 2014/99 to ensure consistency with the description of the goods in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No 217*. Accordingly, the description of the exemption goods in ADN No. 2014/99 is amended as follows:

The Exemption Goods

- *Cherry tomatoes, whether peeled or unpeeled, prepared or preserved otherwise than by vinegar or acetic acid, either whole or in pieces (including diced, chopped or crushed) with or without other ingredients (including vegetables, herbs or spices) in packs not exceeding 1.14 litres in volume.*
- *Certified organic tomatoes, whether peeled or unpeeled, prepared or preserved otherwise than by vinegar or acetic acid, either whole or in pieces (including diced, chopped or crushed) with or without other ingredients (including vegetables, herbs or spices) in packs not exceeding 1.14 litres in volume.*
- *Protected denomination of origin (DOP) certified San Marzano tomatoes, whether peeled or unpeeled, prepared or preserved otherwise than by vinegar or acetic acid, either whole or in pieces (including diced, chopped or*

crushed) with or without other ingredients (including vegetables, herbs or spices) in packs not exceeding 1.14 litres in volume.

All other information contained in ADN No. 2014/99 remains unchanged. This amendment does not change the initiation date.

The new date for the lodgement of submissions is 9 January 2014.
