Penrice closure leaves Osborne site 7 clean-up concerns

The closure of the Penrice soda products plant at Osborne in Adelaide has created the headache of who will clean up the site.

The South Australian
Government says prime
responsibility is with the
company, but it is in
receivership and unlikely to
be able to meet the bill.

The scale of the remediation is not yet known and Planning Minister John Rau will not be drawn on whether the Government will face the cost burden.

"Let's find out how much we're dealing with, let's find out what options it's got, who if anybody has any residual responsibility to clean up and then let's have a conversation about it," he said.

But Mr Rau says residual products left at the site are not dangerous.

"This is not like nuclear waste or toxic material which is likely to be getting into the food chain or people will inhale it and make them sick, it's not that nature of thing," he said.

"It's something which is a by-product of certain industrial processes but it's not of itself a dangerous product."

Council doubts full clean-up possible

Close to 100 workers lost their jobs when the financially troubled company shut down this week after the only potential buyer pulled out.

Penrice owes creditors up to \$200 million.

Port Adelaide-Enfield Mayor Gary Johanson wants the site to remain industrial but doubts a full clean-up is possible.

"I think it's too mammoth a task, whatever happens here we need the State Government to allow a certain amount of fill on the site and potentially cap it so it can be used for industry," he said.

Greens Leader Mark Parnell wants the site fully remediated.

"We cannot just put a fence around a toxic site and let it be, it must be cleaned up," he said.

The local council and the Government both see the site as useful for manufacturing.
