



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2017/103

Customs Act 1901 – Part XV B

CERTAIN ALUMINIUM ROAD WHEELS EXPORTED TO AUSTRALIA FROM THE PEOPLE’S REPUBLIC OF CHINA BY

QINHUANGDAO SINOLION WHEELS CO. LTD

Findings in relation to an Accelerated Review of Anti-Dumping Measures

***Notice under subsection 269ZG(3)(b) of the Customs Act 1901
and subsections 8(5) and 10(3B) of the Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975***

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed the accelerated review, which commenced on 12 April 2017, of the anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice and a countervailing duty notice (the notices) applying to certain aluminium road wheels (the goods) exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China (China) by Qinhuangdao Sinolion Wheels Co. Ltd (Sinolion Wheels).

Recommendations resulting from that accelerated review, reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the accelerated review are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 407 (REP 407)*.

I, CRAIG LAUNDY, Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (Parliamentary Secretary),¹ have considered REP 407 and have decided to accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all the material findings of facts and law set out in REP 407.

Under subsection 269ZG(3)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), I declare that, with effect from 12 April 2017, the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* (the Dumping Duty Act) have effect as if the notices had applied to Sinolion Wheels but the Parliamentary Secretary had fixed specified different variable factors relevant to the determination of duty.

I, CRAIG LAUNDY, the Parliamentary Secretary, determine, pursuant to subsection 8(5) of the Dumping Duty Act, that the interim dumping duty (IDD) payable on the goods exported to Australia from China by Sinolion Wheels is an amount worked out in accordance with the floor price duty method as set out in subsection 5(4) of the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Regulation 2013*, with effect from 12 April 2017.

I, CRAIG LAUNDY, the Parliamentary Secretary, direct, pursuant to subsection 10(3B) of the Dumping Duty Act, that the interim countervailing duty (ICD) payable in respect of the goods exported to Australia from China by Sinolion Wheels be ascertained as a proportion of the export price of those particular goods as set out in subsection 10(3B)(b) of the Dumping Duty Act, with effect from 12 April 2017.

The fixed IDD and ICD rates are outlined in the table below.

IDD will be payable on the goods exported by Sinolion Wheels only when the actual export price is below the ascertained normal value which is a specified (confidential) amount per aluminium road wheel.

The actual duty liability may be higher than the fixed rate of duty in the table above due to a number of factors.
