



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2017/100
Certain Aluminium Extrusions

Exported from the People's Republic of China

**Withdrawal of application for Accelerated Review of
anti-dumping measures**

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 30 May 2017, I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, initiated an accelerated review of the anti-dumping measures applying to certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China), in so far as they relate to a new exporter, Skyline Aluminium Co. Ltd. (Skyline).

Notice of my decision to not reject the application and to initiate the accelerated review was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website on 30 May 2017.

In a letter dated 7 July 2017, Skyline advised the Commission that it has decided to withdraw its application for accelerated review of the anti-dumping measures applying to it.

Since Skyline has withdrawn its application for accelerated review, I have ceased the accelerated review of anti-dumping measures applicable to Skyline.

Securities

Cessation of this accelerated review means that any securities put in place at the initiation of the accelerated review and taken under section 42 of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) pursuant to subsection 269ZH(b) of the Act, will be converted to interim dumping duty and interim countervailing duty.

The applicable rates of duty are the 'all other exporters' rates specified in the dumping duty notice and countervailing duty notice, as altered from time to time. Future exports of aluminium extrusions to Australia by Skyline will also be subject to this rate of duty.
