



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2017/43

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

Certain Aluminium Extrusions

Exported by Foshan Shunde Beijiao Jiawei Aluminium Factory

from the People's Republic of China

Findings in relation to an Accelerated Review of Anti-Dumping Measures

***Notice under subsection 269ZG(3)(b) of the Customs Act 1901
and subsections 8(5) and 10(3B) of the Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975***

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission has completed the accelerated review, which commenced on 14 December 2016, of the anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice and a countervailing duty notice, applying to certain aluminium extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China by Foshan Shunde Beijiao Jiawei Aluminium Factory ('the applicant').

Recommendations resulting from that accelerated review, reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the accelerated review are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 387* (REP 387).

I, CRAIG LAUNDY, the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary)¹, have considered REP 387 and have decided to accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all the material findings of facts and law set out in REP 387.

Under subsection 269ZG(3)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), I DECLARE that, with effect from 14 December 2016, the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* (the Dumping Duty Act) have effect as if the original dumping duty notice and countervailing duty notice had applied to the applicant but the Parliamentary Secretary had specified different variable factors relevant to the determination of duty.

I, CRAIG LAUNDY, the Parliamentary Secretary, DETERMINE, pursuant to subsection 8(5) of the Dumping Duty Act, that the interim dumping duty payable on the goods

exported to Australia by the applicant is an amount that has been worked out in accordance with the combination of fixed and variable duty method pursuant to subsection 5(2) of the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Regulation 2013* with effect from 14 December 2016.

I, CRAIG LAUNDY, the Parliamentary Secretary, DIRECT, pursuant to subsection 10(3B) of the Dumping Duty Act, that the amount of interim countervailing duty payable on the goods exported to Australia by the applicant be ascertained as a proportion of the export price of the goods with effect from 14 December 2016.

The effective rate of combined interim dumping and countervailing duty is outlined in the table below.

Exporter	Fixed component of interim dumping duty	Interim countervailing duty	Effective rate of combined interim countervailing duty and interim dumping duty	Duty Method
Foshan Shunde Beijiao Jiawei Aluminium Factory	0.0%	0.0%	0.0%	Dumping – combination of fixed and variable duty method. Countervailing – proportion of the export price of the goods.

The actual duty liability may be higher than the effective rate of duty due to a number of factors.
