# **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2017/66**

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB*

## **Certain aluminium extrusions**

**Exported from the People’s Republic of China**

### **Termination of an accelerated review of anti-dumping measures**

On 2 March 2017, I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner), initiated an accelerated review of the anti-dumping measures (in the form of a dumping duty notice and a countervailing duty notice) applying to certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China in so far as they relate to a new exporter, Tongliao Jiaojian Aluminium Co., Ltd. (Jiaojian).

Pursuant to subsection 269ZH(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), the Commonwealth required and took securities under section 42 of the Act in respect of interim dumping duty and interim countervailing duty that may be payable on exports by Jiaojian of certain aluminium extrusions for the period of the accelerated review.

#### Grounds for termination

Having regard to the time specified under the Act to complete an accelerated review, and noting that Jiaojian has been granted two extensions of time to provide the information required to complete the accelerated review, but has failed to provide this information, I am satisfied that Jiaojian is refusing to co-operate with aspects of the accelerated review. Therefore, I have terminated the accelerated review in accordance with subsection 269ZE(3)(a) of the Act.

#### Effect of the termination of the accelerated review

Termination of this accelerated review means that securities required and taken on aluminium extrusions exported by Jiaojian and entered for home consumption in the period 20 February 2017 to 11 May 2017 will now be converted to interim dumping duty and interim countervailing duty.

The applicable rates of duty are the 'All other and uncooperative exporters' rates of interim dumping duty and interim countervailing duty specified in the notice made under subsection 269ZHG(1)(b) of the Act and published in *The Australian* and the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* on 20 October 2015.<sup>1</sup> Future exports of aluminium extrusions to Australia by Jiaojian will also be subject to these rates of duty.
