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## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2018/037**

**Review of measures relating to consumer pineapple  
exported to Australia from the Kingdom of Thailand by  
Kuiburi Fruit Canning Co., Ltd. and  
Kuiburi Fruit Cup Co., Ltd.**

**Extension of time granted to issue the  
Statement of essential facts and the final report for  
Review No. 455**

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB*

On 24 November 2017, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice (initiation notice) announcing the initiation of two reviews of anti-dumping measures relating to certain consumer pineapple (the goods) exported to Australia from the Kingdom of Thailand (Thailand). Each review is limited to examining whether the variable factors relevant to the taking of the anti-dumping measures as they affect each particular applicant have changed. The two reviews are:

- Review No. 453 – relating to an application by Prime Products Industry Co., Ltd. (PPI); and
- Review No. 455 - relating to a joint application by Kuiburi Fruit Canning Co., Ltd. (KFC) and Kuiburi Fruit Cup Co., Ltd (KFCup).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2017/171. This ADN is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au).

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the reviews would be placed on the public record by 14 March 2018. The initiation notice advised that the SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base his recommendations to the relevant Minister.

The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the relevant Minister for the reviews would be made in a final report on or before 30 April 2018.

Further time is required to verify information received in relation to Review No. 455.

I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission<sup>1</sup>, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Assistant Minister for Science, Jobs and Innovation and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Jobs and Innovation (the Parliamentary Secretary) in relation to the reviews<sup>2</sup> in relation to Review No. 455.

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,<sup>3</sup> extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary in relation to Review No. 455.<sup>4</sup>

The SEF for Review No. 455 will now be placed on the public record no later than 14 May 2018. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary for Review No. 455 will now be made in a report due on or before 29 June 2018.
