INVESTIGATION INTO ALLEGED DUMPING AND SUBSIDISATION OF DEEP DRAWN STAINLESS STEEL SINKS FROM CHINA

NOTE FOR FILE – ADDITIONAL EXTENSIONS TO EXPORTER QUESTIONNAIRE

Background

On 22 April 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) placed a Note for File on its Public Record, notifying interested parties to the investigation into deep drawn stainless steel sinks from China of extensions granted to eight Chinese suppliers of the concerned goods to submit responses to the Exporter Questionnaire for the investigation.

Following the publication of that Note for File, the Commission has granted similar extensions to a further three Chinese parties. The details of these extensions are outlined below.

Reasons for requesting extensions

Reasons provided for requesting an extension in time to complete the Exporter Questionnaire included:

- leave of key staff;
- complexity of the questionnaire;
- public holidays in early April;
- unfamiliarity with participating in anti-dumping investigations; and
- the need to prepare multiple responses for related companies.

Extensions granted

As at **29 April 2014**, the below additional extensions (to those notified on 22 April 2014) to submit the Exporter Questionnaire have been granted by the Commission.
