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## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2017/35**

### **Aluminium Zinc Coated Steel and Zinc Coated (Galvanised) Steel**

### **Exported from the Republic of Korea**

### **Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and Final Report in relation to a Review of Anti-Dumping Measures**

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB*

On 7 December 2016, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of reviews of the anti-dumping measures, in the form of dumping duty notices, applying to aluminium zinc coated steel and zinc coated (galvanised) steel (the goods) exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea as they affect Dongbu Steel Co., Ltd, an exporter of the goods.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) Nos. 2016/129 and 2016/130 (initiation notices). The initiation notices are available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au).

The initiation notices advised that the statement of essential facts (SEFs) for these reviews would be placed on the public record on or before 27 March 2017.<sup>1</sup> The initiation notices also advised that recommendations to the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary)<sup>2</sup> would be made in a final report on or before 11 May 2017.

To enable the exporter to complete their exporter questionnaire and to provide relevant data to the review, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager Investigations, requested an extension to the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary, under subsection 269ZHI(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).<sup>3</sup>

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act,<sup>4</sup> extended the deadline to publish the SEF for both reviews and provide his final report and recommendations. The SEF will now be placed on the public record on or before **3 May 2017**. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

Recommendations in relation to both reviews will now be made in a report due on or before **17 June 2017**.
