AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2013/38

Processed Dried Currants

Exported from Greece

Finding in relation to a review of anti-dumping measures

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

The Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (Customs and Border Protection) has completed its review of the anti-dumping measures applying to processed dried currants exported from Greece by Agricultural Co-Op Union Aeghion (Aeghion). The review commenced on 24 October 2012.

Customs and Border Protection reported its findings and recommendations to the Minister for Home Affairs (the Minister) in International Trade Remedies Branch Report No. 192 (REP 192). The Minister has considered REP 192 and has accepted Customs and Border Protection's recommendations and has ascertained new normal values and non-injurious free on board prices for exports of processed dried currants exported from Greece by Aeghion.

Notice of the Minister's decision was published in The Australian newspaper and the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette on 13 May 2013. The revised measures will apply to those goods exported from and entered for home consumption from the date of publication of the Minister's decision.

Customs and Border Protection has found that the ascertained export price (AEP) and normal value for exports of processed dried currants to Australia from Greece by Aeghion have increased. The non-injurious price (NIP) has also increased. From this review of the variable factors, the NIP is the operative measure for processed dried currants exported from Greece by Aeghion. The effective rate of duty for Aeghion is 0%.

To preserve confidentiality, details of the revised variable factors will not be published. Bona fide importers of the goods can obtain details of the new rates from the Regional Dumping Liaison Officer in their respective capital city.
