

## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/30**

## Certain Hollow Structural Sections Exported from the People's Republic of China

## Further extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

## Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

On 1 October 2014 I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures and countervailing measures in respect of certain hollow structural sections (HSS) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China) by Tianjin Youfa Steel Pipe Group Co. Ltd (Tianjin Youfa).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/93. This ADN is available on the internet at <a href="https://www.adcommission.gov.au">www.adcommission.gov.au</a>.

The initiation notice advised that a statement of essential facts (SEF) for the review would be placed on the public record by 19 January 2015. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base my recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary). The Minister for Industry and Science approved an extension to the deadline to publish the SEF to 4 March 2015 (ADN No. 2015/07 refers).

Due to the identification of further complex issues that directly affect the Anti-Dumping Commission's (the Commission's) assessment of the variable factors relevant to the determination of any dumping duty and countervailing duty payable in relation to goods exported by Tianjin Youfa, I requested a further extension of the deadline for the publication of the SEF under subsection 269ZHI(1)(d) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the deadline for publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 3 May 2015. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will be made in a report due on or before 17 June 2015.
