



## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/106**

### **Preserved Mushrooms Exported from the People's Republic of China Revocation Review Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts**

#### ***Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB***

On 4 May 2015, I, Dale Seymour, Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission published a notice announcing the initiation of a revocation review of the anti-dumping measures applying to preserved mushrooms exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2015/52. This ADN is available on the internet at [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au).

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the revocation review would be placed on the public record by 22 August 2015. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary).

The revocation review was initiated on the basis of an application which stated that current anti-dumping measures are no longer warranted because the sole Australian manufacturer of preserved mushrooms had ceased manufacturing.

Subsequent to the initiation of the revocation review, an Australian producer of preserved mushrooms lodged an application seeking an inquiry into whether continuation of the anti-dumping measures is justified. The continuation inquiry was initiated on 24 July 2015 (ADN No. 2015/92 refers). Since both the revocation review and the continuation inquiry relate to the same dumping duty notice, I requested an extension of the deadline for the publication of the SEF for the revocation review under subsection 269ZHI(1)(d) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) to align the two matters.

The Parliamentary Secretary on 19 August 2015, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 24 October 2015. Interested parties will be invited to make submissions to the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 8 December 2015.
