**REVIEW OF MEASURES  
HOT ROLLED COIL STEEL  
EXPORTED TO AUSTRALIA FROM TAIWAN**

**NOTE FOR FILE – RESPONSES TO IMPORTER QUESTIONNAIRE**

**Background**

On 27 November 2017, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) advised interested parties that the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission had initiated a review of the anti-dumping measures applying to all exporters of hot rolled coil steel exported to Australia from Japan, the Republic of Korea, Malaysia and Taiwan (as outlined in Anti-Dumping Notice No. 2017/173).<sup>1</sup> The Commission requested that importers cooperate with the review by completing an importer questionnaire, as published on the Commission's website. The questionnaire requested information regarding:

- supplier details;
- imported goods (including cost to import and sell);
- forward orders; and
- Australian sales.

The due date for responses to the importer questionnaire was set at **11 January 2018**.

**Responses received**

As of 1 February 2018, the Commission has received a response to the importer questionnaire from:

- Stemcor (S.E.A.) Pte Ltd; and
- CITIC Australia Steel Products Pty Ltd.

The Commission may seek to visit these importers to conduct verification of information provided in the respective responses to the importer questionnaire.
