**Termination of an Accelerated Review**

***Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB***

On 8 February 2013, Australian Customs Dumping Notice (ACDN) 2013/16 was published, providing notification that the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (Customs and Border Protection) had commenced an accelerated review of the current dumping duty and countervailing duty notices in respect of certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from China in so far as they related to Guangdong Jinxiecheng Al. Manufacturing Co., Ltd (Guangdong Jinxiecheng).

As the application for the accelerated review was not rejected by the CEO, the lodgement date of 18 January 2013 was the initiation date of the accelerated review.

**Effect of the accelerated review**

As the delegate did not reject the application, and continued the accelerated review, a declaration under subsection 269ZH(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) was made to ensure securities in respect of anti-dumping duty and countervailing dumping duty that were payable on exports of certain aluminium extrusions were collected for the period of the review.

**Termination grounds**

Guangdong Jinxiecheng was sent an exporter questionnaire to complete by 18 March 2013. No response to the exporter questionnaire was received by the due date.

The refusal to furnish a response to the exporter questionnaire amounts to a refusal to cooperate with an aspect of the review, and in accordance with paragraph 269ZE(3)(a) of the Act, Customs and Border Protection recommended that the delegate of the CEO terminate the review.

#### Effect of the termination of the accelerated review


Termination of this accelerated review means that if Guangdong Jinxiacheng has exported aluminium extrusions that are subject to securities (i.e. aluminium extrusions exported by Guangdong Jinxiacheng that were imported and entered for home consumption in Australia between 18 January 2013 to 11 April 2013) these securities will now be converted to interim dumping duty and interim countervailing duty.

The effective rates of duty are at the 'Selected non-cooperating exporters' rate specified in the dumping duty notice and countervailing duty notice published by Customs and Border Protection on 27 August 2011 and can be found at: <http://www.customs.gov.au/anti-dumping/reference-material.asp#EffectiveRates>

Future exports of aluminium extrusions by Guangdong Jinxiacheng will also be subject to this level of measures.
