Please find attached a letter of authority from ABB Zhongshan Transformer Co., Ltd. We would be grateful if you could please direct all communications relating to our client to myself in the first instance.

The company respectfully requests an extension of time to submit its Exporter Questionnaire response. There are a number of reasons for this.

Firstly, as discussed during our meeting last Friday, the product concerned is quite complicated and is very different from an ordinary commodity.

Secondly, ABB Zhongshan and the other ABB companies subject to this investigation have never been involved in an anti-dumping investigation before and it has taken some time to arrange the professional representation and the corporate coordination needed for it to adequately respond to the EQ.

Further, due to the nature of the products, ABB Zhongshan also needs more time and clarification from ADC in order to fully understand the information required for the EQ response, particularly in relation to Section D and Section G.

Given these circumstances, ABB Zhongshan respectfully requests an extension of time to Tuesday 1 October. Additionally, we would be grateful if you could please provide the clarifications sought at our Friday meeting as soon as possible.
