### Discussed:

- Capral objects to the letter from the Commission dated 23 January 2014 regarding the scope of the review.
- The Commission reiterated its reasons for the position outlined in the letter. It considered that if the additional matters set out in Capral's submission were to be examined by the Commission it would be done in the context of a general review of measures.
- Discussion of the likelihood and timing of Capral lodging an application for a general review and the upcoming advertisement in late 2014 of the expiry of the measures and seeking applications for continuation.
- Discussion around Capral's submission requesting the Commission re-examine the premium added to the benchmark price for aluminium, including discussion of the LME trading mechanism and the different trading conditions in China.
- Discussion around assistance that could be provided by the Commission to Capral in the context of preparing any application for review that intended to raise new dumping or countervailing issues. The Commission advised that its enhanced client engagement service may be able to assist in this regard.
- General discussion about anti-circumvention framework.
