



**REVIEW OF HOT ROLLED STRUCTURAL STEEL SECTIONS EXPORTED TO
AUSTRALIA
FROM THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA**

File note - Extension of time for questionnaire response

On 19 March 2018, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) initiated a review (review no. 465) of the anti-dumping measures applying to certain hot rolled structural steel sections exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea.

The Commission notified Mitsubishi Australia Ltd (Mitsubishi) that the importer questionnaire response in relation to review 465 was due by no later than 9 April 2018. On 5 April 2018, the Commission received a request from Mitsubishi for an extension of time to provide a response to the importer questionnaire.

The Commission notified Hyundai Steel Company (Hyundai) that the exporter questionnaire response in relation to review 465 was due by no later than 26 April 2018. On 16 April 2018, the Commission received a request from Hyundai for an extension of time to provide a response to the exporter questionnaire.

Due consideration was given to the extension request by the General Manager, Investigations of the Commission, having regard to Mitsubishi's and Hyundai's circumstances and the *Customs (Extensions of Time and Non-cooperation) Direction 2015*.¹

The following table summarises the extension of time granted in relation to Mitsubishi and Hyundai, and provides the revised due dates for the questionnaire responses.
