REVIEW OF ANTI-DUMPING MEASURES IN RELATION TO POLYVINYL
CHLORIDE HOMOPOLYMER RESIN (PVC) EXPORTED FROM JAPAN, THE
REPUBLIC OF KOREA AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

MEETING WITH AUSTRALIAN VINYL CORPORATION PTY LTD

The Commission held a teleconference with Australian Vinyls on 17 December 2015.

During this meeting the Commission sought to clarify with Australian Vinyls the anticipated last delivery date for domestically manufactured PVC. Australian Vinyls advised that they anticipated they would be making deliveries of Australian manufactured PVC up until [REDACTED] [last delivery date]. Australian Vinyls further advised that, even though they would continue making deliveries of Australian PVC until early 2016, they believed that the 1 January 2016 was a reasonable date for the measures to be revoked from. Australia Vinyls advised that a revocation date of 1 January 2016 would enable customers to make alternative arrangements for the supply of PVC. It was further noted by John O'Connor that another interested party had specified in a submission that 1 January 2015 was an acceptable revocation date.

During the teleconference Australian Vinyls indicated that they were not aware of any other domestic manufacturers of PVC in Australia. Australian Vinyls further advised that the only other Australian manufacturer of PVC ceased production in 2002. Australian Vinyls also advised they were not aware of any other entity seeking to commence manufacturing PVC in Australia.
