Public notice under subsection 269ZDB(1A)(b)

Consumer pineapple exported from the Kingdom of Thailand

Notice for longer period for the decision of the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed a review of the anti-dumping measures in the form of a dumping duty notice (the notice) applying to consumer pineapple exported to Australia from Kingdom of Thailand by Kuiburi Fruit Canning Co., Ltd and Kuiburi Fruit Cup Co., Ltd.

Copies of the application and various submissions made in relation to the review are available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The Commissioner provided his final report and recommendations to the then Assistant Minister for Science, Jobs and Innovation on 30 July 2018. Subsection 269ZDB(1A)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) requires the relevant Minister to make their decision on the outcome of this review within 30 days after receiving the Commissioner's report, that is, on or before **29 August 2018**.

Where there are special circumstances that prevent the decision being made within that period, subsection 269ZDB(1A)(b) of the Act provides that the decision may be within such longer period as the Minister considers appropriate.

Following my appointment as Minister for Industry, Science and Technology, I am now responsible for certain anti-dumping decisions. I consider there are special circumstances and that it is appropriate under subsection 269ZDB(1A) of the Act to extend the period for making my decision for a further 30 days to **28 September 2018** in order to properly consider the Commissioner's final report and recommendations,
