# **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2017/134**

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB*

## **Certain Hollow Structural Sections**

### **Exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China**

### **Cessation of Consideration of an Application Seeking an Accelerated Review of Anti-Dumping Measures**

*Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB*

On 19 June 2017, Sino Sources Tech Co. Ltd (Sino) lodged an application for an accelerated review of the anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice and a countervailing duty notice (the notices), applying to certain hollow structural sections (the goods) exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China, in so far as the notices relate to Sino.

On 10 August 2017, Dale Seymour, Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner), published an Anti-Dumping Notice<sup>1</sup> outlining that he was considering Sino’s application, and making further inquiries, in particular concerning Sino’s status as an exporter of the goods.

Following consideration of all relevant information, including the application and evidence gathered from Sino and other parties, I, Paul Sexton, Acting Commissioner, have determined that Sino is not an exporter of the goods. As Sino is not an exporter, it cannot be considered a ‘new exporter’.

Accordingly, Sino was not entitled to apply for the accelerated review under subsection 269ZE(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act). Therefore, I have ceased considering the application.

#### **Securities**

Ceasing to consider the application means that all securities put in place at the time of the application and taken under section 42 of the Act pursuant to subsection 269ZH(b) of the Act, will be converted to interim dumping duty and interim countervailing duty.

The applicable rates of duty are the ‘all other exporters’ rates specified in the notices, as altered from time to time. Future exports of the goods to Australia involving Sino will also be subject to these rates of duty.
