



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2018/30

Certain aluminium zinc coated steel

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue the final report in relation to two reviews of anti-dumping measures

Customs Act 1901 – Part XV B

On 8 May 2017, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of two reviews of anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice and a countervailing duty notice, in respect of certain aluminium zinc coated steel (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China as they affect Baoshan Iron & Steel Co., Ltd (Baosteel) and Shanghai Meishan Iron & Steel Co., Ltd (Meisteel).

A full description of the goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2017/63 (initiation notice). The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission's) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that a recommendation to the relevant Minister would be made in a final report on or before 10 October 2017.

On 10 October 2017 and 8 December 2017, extensions to the deadline to provide a final report and recommendations to the relevant Minister were granted.¹

I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission, have now sought a further extension of time from the Commissioner,² under subsection 269ZHI(1)(e) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), to provide interested parties with the opportunity to comment on the Commission's application of the new provisions under section 269TAB³ of the Act before a final report is provided to the Assistant Minister for Science, Jobs and Innovation and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Jobs and Innovation (Parliamentary Secretary).⁴

³ The *Customs Amendment (Anti-Dumping Measures) Act 2017* received the royal assent on 30 October 2017. The amended legislation applies to ongoing reviews of measures (under Division 5 of the Act) where a decision by the Minister had not been made prior to the royal assent, which means the amended legislation applies to the reviews of measures relevant to Baosteel and Meisteel.

⁴ On 20 December 2017, the Prime Minister appointed the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Jobs and Innovation as the Assistant Minister for Science, Jobs and Innovation. For the purposes of this review, the Minister is the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Jobs and Innovation.

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act,⁵ extended the deadline to provide his final report and recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary. Recommendations in relation to both reviews will now be made in a report due on or before **27 March 2018**.
