Dear Scott

We refer to the above Review of Anti-Dumping Measures and Exporter Questionnaire with response due 21 August 2017.

After careful consideration by Management, Alpine Pipe Manufacturing SDN BHD ("Alpine") have decided they cannot justify participating in this Review of Anti-Dumping Measures and will not be completing a Response to Exporter Questionnaire due to the following reasons:-

- The cost and disruption to business operations of participating in completing a Response to Exporter Questionnaire and subsequent verification process, cannot be commercially justified, (given export volumes to Australia and Australian market total volume).*
- Particularly, so soon after completing recent Continuation Inquiry and Review of Anti-Dumping Measures with initiation dates of 31 October 2016 and final findings published on 26 June 2017, which are still subject to potential Anti-Dumping Review Panel scrutiny. For the applicant to make another Review of Anti-Dumping Measures on 23 June 2017 three days before final decision on previous inquiry, it is clearly tactical to frustrate potential exporters to Australia, creating a barrier to entry, if not an abuse of process.*
- In addition, Alpine are not satisfied with the approach and assessment of dumping, undertaken by the Commission in the most recent inquiry, which is subject to an Anti-Dumping Review Panel application, however disillusioned regarding receiving fair and accurate treatment in any future inquiries.*

Due to the above reasons, Alpine will pursue other export markets where fair trade values are pursued, and unfortunately not participate in the Australian market.
