

AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2012/55

Aluminium Extrusions

Exported from The People's Republic of China

Finding in relation to a review of anti-dumping measures

Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

The Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (Customs and Border Protection) has completed its review of the anti-dumping measures applying to aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China) by Wuxi Xisha Photoelectric Aluminium Products Co. Ltd. The review commenced on 21 May 2012.

Customs and Border Protection reported its findings and recommendations to the Minister for Home Affairs (the Minister) in International Trade Remedies Branch Report No. 186 (REP 186). The Minister has considered REP 186 and has accepted Customs and Border Protection's recommendations.

Notice of the Minister's decision was published in *The Australian* newspaper and the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* on 21 November 2012. The revised measures will apply to those goods exported from China by Wuxi Xisha Photoelectric Aluminium Products Co. Ltd and entered for home consumption from the date of publication of the Minister's decision on 21 November 2012.

The reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the review of measures are contained in REP 186. To preserve confidentiality, details of the revised variable factors will not be published. Bona fide importers of the goods can obtain details of the new rates from the Regional Dumping Liaison Officer in their respective capital city.
