ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2014/61

Certain Aluminium Extrusions

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue Final Report for an anti-circumvention inquiry

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 14 April 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of an anti-circumvention inquiry in respect of certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/31. This ADN is available on the internet at <u>www.adcommission.gov.au</u>.

The initiation notice advised that a Final Report and recommendations about the inquiry would be made to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry (the Parliamentary Secretary) on or before 23 July 2014.

Due to the complexity of the policy and legal issues surrounding the Commission's first anti-circumvention inquiry, as well as delays in the provision of information by importers, I requested, pursuant to subsection 269ZHI(1)(ec) of the *Customs Act 1901*, an extension of the deadline for submission of the Final Report to the Parliamentary Secretary.

The Parliamentary Secretary has, as a result of that request, extended the deadline for submission of the Final Report to **6 September 2014**. The Parliamentary Secretary's decision for this inquiry is due on or before **6 October 2014**, unless extended.
