Purpose of meeting:

The purpose of the meeting was for Austube Mills Pty Ltd (ATM) to provide the Commission a better understanding of the impact of adding boron to hollow structural sections (HSS).

Discussion:

- The Commission provided an update of the progress of the inquiry, including the extension to the SEF due date to 5 November 2015, which has recently been approved by the Parliamentary Secretary.
- The Commission sought further clarity regarding the impact of adding boron to HSS and potential legitimate uses of boron-added HSS.
- ATM advised that they will be making public submissions in relation to the views expressed during the meeting, including suggested alterations to the original notice and suggested ways of managing legitimate exports. These submissions will be made in due course.
