

## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2013/86**

## **Greyback cartonboard**

## **Exported from the Republic of Korea**

## Findings in Relation to a Revocation Review of Anti-Dumping Measures

Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

The Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) has completed its revocation review, which commenced on 16 May 2013, of the anti-dumping measures applying to greyback cartonboard ("the goods") exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea.

The Commission reported its findings and recommendations to the Minister for Industry (the Minister) in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report to the Minister No. 210* (REP 210). The Minister has considered REP 210 and has accepted the Commission's recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all material findings of fact or law set out in the Report.

Under subsection 269ZDB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), the Minister declared that, for the purposes of the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975:* 

- to the extent that the anti-dumping measures concerning the goods involved the publication of a dumping duty notice that, with effect from 8 June 2013, the notice is taken to have been revoked in relation to exporters generally; and
- to the extent that the anti-dumping measures concerning the goods involved the
  acceptance by the Minister of an undertaking that, with effect from the date of
  publication of this notice, Klean Nara Co Ltd formerly known as Daehan Pulp Co.
  Ltd is released from the undertaking and that the investigation giving rise to the
  undertaking is terminated.

If interim dumping duty has been paid in relation to goods exported to Australia after <u>8 June 2013</u>, importers may apply for a refund. Information about how to apply can be obtained by emailing <u>nationalrefunds@customs.gov.au</u> or telephone number +61 8 8447 9310.

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel (<a href="www.adreviewpanel.gov.au">www.adreviewpanel.gov.au</a>) in accordance with the requirements in Division 9 of Part XVB of the Act, within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
