



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2014/67

Newsprint Exported from France and the Republic of Korea

Extension of time granted to issue the statement of essential facts

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 22 April 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of newsprint exported to Australia from France and the Republic of Korea.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/34. This ADN is available on the Commission's website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 11 August 2014. The SEF will set out the facts on which I, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, propose to base my recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary.

The Commission requires additional time to properly consider the issues in this case, including some complexities in assessing the materiality of injury caused by dumping. Having regard also to the ongoing high case workload of the Commission, I have requested an extension of the deadline for the publication of the SEF.

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under section 269ZHI of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than **29 October 2014**.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 13 December 2014. Documents included in the public record are available at www.adcommission.gov.au.
