ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/24

Certain Polyvinyl Chloride Flat Electric Cables exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 6 November 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of certain polyvinyl chloride (PVC) flat electric cables exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/118. This ADN is available on the internet at <u>www.adcommission.gov.au</u>.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 24 February 2015. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary).

Due to extensions of time allowed for various interested parties to supply information and the need to carefully verify that information for the purpose of calculating dumping margins, I requested an extension of the deadline for the publication of the SEF under subsection 269ZHI(1)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 25 May 2015. Interested parties will be invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 9 July 2015.
