INVESTIGATION INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF HOT ROLLED STRUCTURAL STEEL EXPORTED TO AUSTRALIA FROM JAPAN, THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA, TAIWAN AND THAILAND

The Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) wrote to you by email on 12 December 2013 to notify you that the exporter questionnaire submitted on 2 December contained deficiencies, and subsequently requested that a fully completed exporter questionnaire be submitted by 23 December.

A fully completed exporter questionnaire is considered relevant information to enable the Commission to adequately determine whether dumping is occurring.

As a fully completed questionnaire response has not been received by the Commission by the due date, I am satisfied that Mitsui & Co Ltd did not give information relevant to the investigation within a reasonable period, and now consider Mitsui & Co Ltd to be an uncooperative exporter as defined under section 269T(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act). Accordingly, a dumping margin for Mitsui & Co Ltd will be determined in accordance with section 269TACAB(1) of the Act.

As an interested party, as defined under section 269T(1) of the Act, Mitsui & Co Ltd can still participate in the investigation by providing the Commission with submissions on any issues relevant to the consideration of the publication of a dumping duty notice.
