Purpose of visit:

The purpose of the visit was to clarify aspects of the Importer Questionnaire response received from CITIC Australia.

Discussion:

- The Commission sought further evidence from CITIC Australia regarding the end use and purpose of alloyed galvanised steel.
- The Commission sought further clarity regarding the benefits of adding boron to galvanised steel imported to Australia including reasons previously provided in the Importer Questionnaire such as reducing strain hardening and providing a longer shelf life for steel products.
- CITIC Australia raised a number of other matters concerning the investigation, and advised that they will be making further public submissions on these matters in due course.
