ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/103

Anti-circumvention inquiry into the slight modification of Zinc Coated (Galvanised) Steel exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea and Taiwan

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

Customs Act 1901 – Part XV B

On 5 May 2015, I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission published a notice announcing the initiation of an anti-circumvention inquiry into the slight modification of goods exported to Australia. The alleged circumvention goods are alloyed zinc coated (galvanised) steel exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea and Taiwan.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2015/55. This ADN is available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the inquiry would be placed on the public record by 23 August 2015. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary).

This anti-circumvention inquiry, relating to the slight modification of goods, is one of three currently being undertaken. These three are the first of this type since the introduction of the anti-circumvention regulation. Accordingly, additional time is required to analyse the data received and (if necessary) seek further information from interested parties. This will ensure that both this additional data received as well as policy and legal issues that relate to this inquiry can be adequately addressed. As a result, I requested an extension of the deadline for the publication of the SEF under subsection 269ZH(1)(ea) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under section 269ZH(3) of the Act, extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 5 November 2015. Interested parties will be invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 21 December 2015.
