**INVESTIGATION INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF
HOT ROLLED STRUCTURAL STEEL EXPORTED TO AUSTRALIA
FROM JAPAN, THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA, TAIWAN AND THAILAND**

On 2 December 2013, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) notified you via email that your request to extend the due date for submission of your exporter questionnaire to 23 December had been granted.

A fully completed exporter questionnaire is considered relevant information to enable the Commission to adequately determine whether dumping is occurring.

As a fully completed questionnaire response has not been received by the Commission by the due date, I am satisfied that Hyosung Corporation did not give information relevant to the investigation within a reasonable period, and now consider Hyosung Corporation to be an uncooperative exporter as defined under section 269T(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act). Accordingly, a dumping margin for Hyosung Corporation will be determined in accordance with section 269TACAB(1) of the Act.

As an interested party, as defined under section 269T(1) of the Act, Hyosung Corporation can still participate in the investigation by providing the Commission with submissions on any issues relevant to the consideration of the publication of a dumping duty notice.
