**REVIEW OF ANTI-DUMPING MEASURES RELATING TO
DALIAN STEELFORCE HI-TECH CO LTD**

CALCULATION ERROR IN STATEMENT OF ESSENTIAL FACTS 285**

Background

On 9 April 2015, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) initiated a review (Review 285) into the anti-dumping measures applying to certain hollow structural sections (HSS) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China by Dalian Steelforce Hi-Tech Co., Ltd.

Statement of Essential Facts 285 (SEF 285) in relation to the review was published on 28 July 2015, and is available on the Commission's public record.

SEF 285 sets out the facts on which the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission proposes to base his recommendations to the Assistant Minister for Science and Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (Parliamentary Secretary)¹ in relation to the review.

Calculation error found in SEF 285

Since the publication of SEF 285, the Commission has become aware of a calculation error pertaining to the ascertained dumping margin and countervailable subsidy margin.

In SEF 285, the average weighted dumping margin was stated as negligible, while the countervailable subsidy rate was stated at 3.8 per cent. The amended dumping margin and countervailable subsidy rate, which the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission proposes to recommend to the Parliamentary Secretary, is now 6.3 per cent and 11.3 per cent, respectively.

¹ The Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science has delegated responsibility for anti-dumping matters to the Parliamentary Secretary, and accordingly, the Parliamentary Secretary is the relevant decision-maker for this review of anti-dumping measures.
