Jukka,

On coloured newsprint a clearer answer and Public Record response to your question would be:

1. Coloured newsprint. In Norske Skog's definition of newsprint we indicated a specification of brightness less than 70 ISO. This is really a measure that is only applicable to non- coloured or white newsprint. We would not consider coloured newsprint as a like good to newsprint that is used in Australia for newspaper publishing which is usually white. Norske Skog does not produce coloured newsprint in Australia and we are not aware of any significant volume of coloured newsprint used in Australia.
