

## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2014/117**

## Zinc Coated (Galvanised) Steel Exported from India and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

## Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

## Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

On 11 July 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of zinc coated (galvanised) steel exported to Australia from India and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/55. This ADN is available on the Commission's website at <a href="https://www.adcommission.gov.au">www.adcommission.gov.au</a>.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 29 October 2014. The SEF will set out the facts on which I, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, propose to base recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry (the Parliamentary Secretary).

Primarily due to the ongoing high case workload of the Commission, which has impacted the availability of staff for verification visits, I requested an extension of the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The Parliamentary Secretary has, under section 269ZHI of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than **18 March 2015**.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 2 May 2015.
