ANTI-CIRCUMVENTION INQUIRY 447

**ALUMINIUM EXTRUSIONS EXPORTED THROUGH ONE OR MORE
THIRD COUNTRIES FROM THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA**

MEETING WITH CAPRAL ALUMINIUM

12 December 2017

Meeting Summary

The Commission met with Capral Aluminium (Capral) on 12 December 2017. During this meeting with the Commission Capral provided further information regarding the inquiry. Capral reiterated its concerns of potential circumvention of duties payable on aluminium extrusions (the circumvention goods) from the People's Republic of China (China).

The meeting was conducted to provide information to Capral and to seek further evidence and information from them regarding the inquiry.

The Anti-Circumvention Inquiry

The Commission informed Capral that it was continuing to meet with members of the Australian industry as part of the inquiry.

Capral indicated it would continue to assist the Commission with the inquiry. Capral affirmed its commitment to the inquiry in 'any way it could' to reach its desired outcome, being a positive finding of circumvention and action by the Commission to remedy that circumvention.

At the request of the Commission, Capral provided confidential details of parties that the Commission can contact to obtain information relating to the inquiry. Capral also provided confidential information on parties that may be involved in transshipment of the goods.

The Commission reiterated to Capral to pass on Mr Mäntynen's contact details to any other parties that may be interested or could provide further information to assist the inquiry.

Further discussion was conducted regarding the Australian market and the impact of imports of aluminium extrusions.

The Commission indicated that it continues to examine the information and inquire further as appropriate.
