The visit was conducted to provide information to the Australian industry member and to seek further evidence and information pertaining to the inquiry.

Jukka provided an introduction to the inquiry and the purpose of the visit, including the preparation of a file note for the public record and the responsibility of the Anti-Dumping Commission and its officers to maintain confidentiality in respect of information and data.

Jukka explained that the purpose of the visit is to seek evidence on circumvention and was meeting with members of the industry to seek information, conduct plant tours and to gain knowledge on

market and industry practices that may be of assistance in relation to obtaining evidence from importers and exporters.

Jukka asked Mr Fiddes to provide evidence or other information, including names of individuals or businesses, if it was able to do so, that may be of assistance to the inquiry.

Jukka invited Mr Fiddes to pass on his details to any other parties that may be interested or could provide further information to assist the inquiry.

Mr Fiddes provided his views on evidence that may be available in support of the anti-circumvention claims, and expressed support for the inquiry on the whole.

Mr Fiddes discussed an offer he had received from an import/export agent who had contacted him and offered transshipment services to avoid duties.

Mr Fiddes undertook to provide to the inquiry any further evidence or information he may acquire.

EA provided an overview of its business, its manufacturing process and particularly its process of designing and creating dies. A tour of the plant was conducted.

Further discussion was conducted regarding the Australian market and the impact of imports of aluminium extrusions.

Jukka reiterated his invitation to EA to provide any further information or evidence that may assist the inquiry.
