Meeting Summary

The Commission met with G James Aluminium (G James) on 21 November 2017. During this meeting the Commission provided G James with an update on the anti-circumvention inquiry initiated on 16 October 2017. G James indicated its concerns of potential circumvention of duties payable on aluminium extrusions (the circumvention goods) from the People's Republic of China (China).

The visit was conducted to provide information to the Australian industry member and to seek further evidence and information pertaining to the inquiry.

Jukka provided an introduction to the inquiry and the purpose of the visit, including the preparation of a file note for the public record and the responsibility of the Anti-Dumping Commission and its officers to maintain confidentiality in respect of information and data.

Jukka explained that the purpose of the visit is to seek evidence on circumvention and was meeting with members of the industry to seek information, conduct plant tours and to gain knowledge on market and industry practices that may be of assistance in relation to obtaining evidence from importers and exporters.

Jukka asked G James to provide evidence or other information, including names of individuals or businesses, if it was able to do so, that may be of assistance to the inquiry.

Jukka invited G James to pass on his details to any other parties that may be interested or could provide further information to assist the inquiry.

G James undertook to provide to the inquiry any further evidence or information they may acquire.

G James provided an overview of its business, its manufacturing process and its process of designing and creating dies. A tour of the plant was conducted.

Further discussion was conducted regarding the Australian market and the impact of imports of aluminium extrusions.

Jukka reiterated his invitation to G James to provide any further information or evidence that may assist the inquiry.

G James provided its views on the application and support of the anti-circumvention claims, and expressed support for the inquiry on the whole. G James undertook to provide to the inquiry any further evidence or information it may acquire.

G James provided an overview of its business, its manufacturing process and particularly its process of designing and creating dies. A tour of the plant was conducted.
