Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

On 10 April 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of rod in coils exported to Australia from the Republic of Indonesia, Taiwan and the Republic of Turkey (Turkey).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/27. This ADN is available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 29 July 2014. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry (the Parliamentary Secretary).

The Commission requested an extension of time to the publication of the SEF due to a combination of factors, including:

- further time required to finalise assessing whether in-country verification visits to exporters' premises or remote verification of exporters' data is required depending on recent travel advisories from the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade; and
- delays in the Commission's ability to conduct exporter verification visits, due to the Commission's ongoing heavy investigation caseload.

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under section 269ZHI of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than **17 October 2014**.

Interested parties will be invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 1 December 2014.
