**Investigation No. 447 – Aluminium extrusions exported through one or more third countries from The People’s Republic of China – Further example of transhipping**

I refer to your investigation into the circumvention of anti-dumping measures on aluminium extrusions exported from the People’s Republic of China (“China”).

I highlighted with you earlier that [customer] had been notified that in order to “avoid the anti-dumping duty” it should ship the goods to [country], then re-pack for shipment to Australia, and that the shipping cost via [country] would be cheaper than the interim dumping duty that would be liable on the Chinese exports.


This offer was proposed by [company] which operates in [location].
