

## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/80**

## Aluminium Road Wheels Exported from the People's Republic of China Further extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

On 15 September 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures applying to certain aluminium road wheels exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/86. This ADN is available on the internet at <a href="https://www.adcommission.gov.au">www.adcommission.gov.au</a>.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 5 January 2015. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary).

On 19 December 2015, the Parliamentary Secretary extended the time granted to issue the SEF to 30 June 2015 (as notified in ADN No. 2014/136).

Due to the complexity of the issues surrounding the inquiry, I requested a further extension of the deadline for the publication of the SEF.

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under section 269ZHI(1)(d) of the *Customs Act 1901*, further extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 30 July 2015. Interested parties will be invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 13 September 2015.
