



**REVIEW INTO MEASURES APPLICABLE TO ALUMINIUM ROAD WHEELS
EXPORTED FROM CHINA**

**NOTE FOR FILE - RECORD OF MEETING WITH REPRESENTATIVE FOR
CITIC DICASTAL CO. LTD.**

Background

On 5 June 2015 the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) met with a representative from CITIC Dicastal Co. Ltd. (CITIC Dicastal; an exporter), to discuss the Commission's review into measures applicable to aluminium road wheels exported from China.

Matters discussed

- Mr Reilly raised matters on behalf of CITIC Dicastal including:
 - The delays associated with the review;
 - Potential implications of the Commission's decision not to undertake verification visits with selected exporters;
 - Potential implications of placing dumping margin methodologies and calculations in the Statement of Essential Facts without first providing exporters with the opportunity to check for completeness and accuracy; and
 - The potential inclusion of purchased goods in dumping margin calculations.
- Mr Reilly further submitted that the OEM market should be exempt from measures. Mr Reilly stated that due to the long lead time required to develop OEM products, and the impending closure of the remaining Australian passenger vehicle producers, goods exported from China under OEM contracts were unlikely to be causing injury to the Australian industry.

The Commission noted that while CITIC Dicastal was able to make submissions on any matters it deemed relevant to this review, the issues of injury analysis and revocation of measures are out of scope for this review, because the review was focused on considering whether variable factors applicable to exporters' dumping margins had changed.
