Regarding:: Australian Customs Duty Notice (ACDN) No 2011/43.

I am aware that Onesteel ATM has included post Hot Dipped Galvanised Pipe(HDGP) as part of the products that they are 'alleging' are dumped into Australia. This is despite:

- 1) ATM on our information will no longer stock HDGP, let alone make it
- 2) ATM has a shipment of 3000 tonnes due from Vietnam final shipment
- ATM has the HDGP included in this dumping and subsidy case
- 4) ATM are wanting Customs to impose 15 to 20% Dumping Duty on future imports from Thailand, Malaysia, Taiwan, Korea and for China the 15-20% dumping duty PLUS 40% Subsidy

duty on HDGP ex China (Note the Subsidy amount is based on the recent precedent ruling in the Aluminium extrusions case!)

- 5) Whilst ATM did make HDGP during the Customs investigation period, they ceased production prior to the initiation of this Dumping Action.
- 6) Critically there is no functional substitute for HDGP produced in Australia.
- 7) Supagal or Duragal ARE NOT functional substitutes for HDGP being significantly inferior product manufactured by a different process
- 8) Closing down HDGP production is a permanent decision and not an on/off switch. Note Newcastle HDGP was permanently 'mothballed' in 2007/08.
- 9) ATM may have a new owner to change this decision but until then if you want HDGP other from Onesteel's exclusive Vietnam source you will be paying heaps of extra duty on

something not made in Australia.

10) If dumping and subsidy duties are applied, they will apply for the **next 5 years** providing OneSteel ATM with a market exclusive exemption.

I am deeply concerned about the actions being taken by Onesteel and the ease with which new customs / import processes may facilitate actions being taken which prejudice the vast number of steel value adders which we sell to in Australia and who offer product in free competition to Onesteel. I believe the actions taken by Onesteel are entirely self serving. By alleging dumping by all the countries and companies in close proximity to Australia excepting those it is itself importing from (Vietnam) in essence Onesteel is alleging anti-dumping against the whole world. Whilst I readily concede the world exists beyond Thailand, Malaysia, Taiwan Korea and China the absolute reality is that for pipe production at international market prices other countries cannot produce and ship at competitive prices into Australia.

If effectively Onesteel is alleging dumping against the entire trade-possible world, is it not more likely that Onesteel is simply guilty of poor and non competitive production practice itself?
