**ANTI-CIRCUMVENTION INQUIRY 447**

**ALUMINIUM EXTRUSIONS EXPORTED THROUGH ONE OR MORE  
THIRD COUNTRIES FROM THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA**

**Meeting Summary**

The Commission met with Capral Aluminium (Capral) on 25 January 2018. Capral conveyed its ongoing concerns of possible circumvention of duties payable on aluminium extrusions (the circumvention goods) from the People's Republic of China (China).

The meeting was conducted to provide information to Capral on the progress of the inquiry and to seek further evidence and information from them to facilitate the conduct of the inquiry.

**The Anti-Circumvention Inquiry**

The Commission communicated to Capral that it was continuing to meet with members of the Australian industry as part of the inquiry.

Capral reiterated its commitment to the inquiry and its willingness to provide its services, assistance and relevant information wherever possible to achieve its desired outcome, being a positive finding of circumvention and for the Commission to recommend that remedial measures be implemented.

Capral relayed confidential information on parties potentially implicated in the transshipment of the goods.

Capral was encouraged by the Commission to pass on Mr Mäntynen's contact details to other parties that may be interested or could provide further information to assist the inquiry.

The Commission indicated that it continues to examine the information and undertake additional inquiries as appropriate.

## **PUBLIC RECORD**

The Commission indicated that the length of the extension of time to publish the SEF was necessary in order to properly and thoroughly address the complex issues and to gather evidence.
